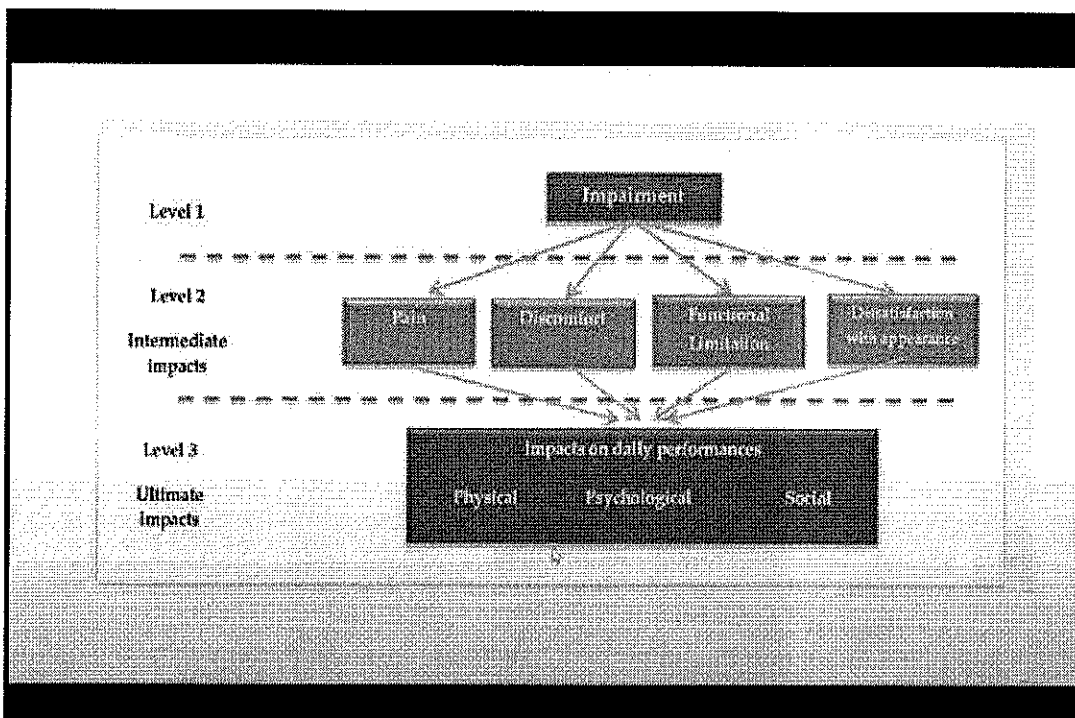

3.0 About the Speaker:

Ms. N. S. Nappinai, Supreme Court Advocate and founder of Cyber Saathi™ (www.cybersaathi.org), is a senior and renowned lawyer (since 1991) focusing on litigation and policy work, apart from her social responsibility engagements for training judges, police, armed forces, students and industry. Ms. Nappinai appears as counsel in cases pertaining to Constitutional, Criminal, IPR & Cyber laws.

Ms. Nappinai is Advisor, Maharashtra – Cyber police and Senior Panel Advocate – Central & Western Railways, Government of India. Ms. Nappinai represented the Government of Kerala in a seminal case pertaining to data protection.

Ms. Nappinai has presented before the National Cyber Security Center, part of the Prime Minister's Office on India's proposed National Cyber Security Policy 2020 – 2025; Ms. Nappinai is part of Government Committees dealing with various policy issues on cyberlaws including the Technical Committee constituted by the Supreme Court in *Re: Prajwala (supra)*. She has presented before the first Interdepartmental Government Committee on Cryptocurrencies & Blockchain. She was invited, as expert, on to Government committees on (i). Amendments to Information Technology Act, 2000 ("IT Act"); & (ii). Electronic Evidence and she contributed to the reports for amendments thereto. She contributed extensively to the drafting of India's Commercial Courts Act, 2015. Nappinai was an Expert Member, Tamil Nadu "State Child Policy Committee" – 2015 – 2016, for formulating the cyber security aspects under the State Child Policy

Inaugural Address was given by Dr.P.V.Vijayaraghavan, Vice Chancellor, Sri Ramachandra Institute of Higher Education and Research.

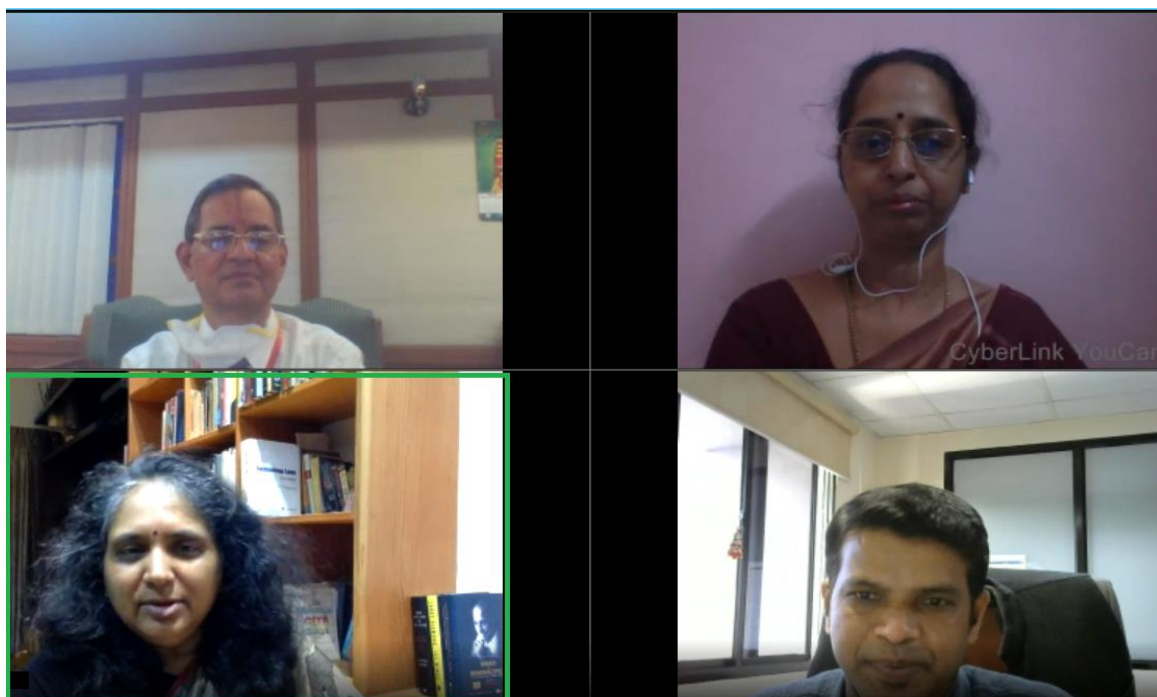

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We should consider that

- Continuous positive airway pressure or noninvasive ventilation with clinical signs of excessive inspiratory efforts, intubation should be prioritized
- Avoid excessive intra thoracic negative pressures and self-inflicted lung injury.
- High PEEP in a poorly recruitable lung tends to result in severe hemodynamic impairment and fluid retention.
- Prone positioning of patients with relatively high compliance provides a modest benefit at the cost of a high demand for stressed human resources.

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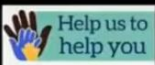

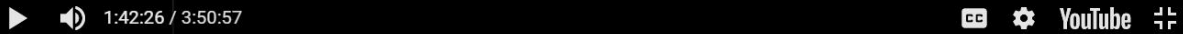

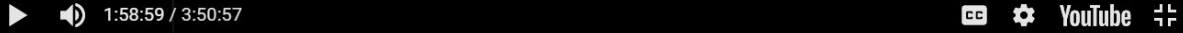

Dynamics of a Tribe

COVID-19 has seen the students of SRIHER lie idle and unenthusiastic the past few months. It's no surprise by the number of surveys they have submitted regarding the deleterious effects of this lockdown on mental health. To break this chain of monotony, the students were graced with the motivational words of Mr. Pravin Sekhar, an entrepreneur, outlier marketer and raconteur on the 6th of November, 2020, who had the listeners hooked from the moment he began with one of his many anecdotes.

Mr. Pravin began by talking about a group of ace surgeons and doctors gathered on a fine New York evening, who were empathizing with the rest, on their failures and how with the advice of each other, one of the doctors' managed to convert his failure into success.

"Sometimes, all we need is a little bit of guidance and a different opinion to make a huge difference."

Mr. Pravin introduced the concept of tribes, which consist of givers, takers and balancers. The success of a tribe is determined by a rational balance; which had the students enlightened. He emphasized its importance for a career like medicine. Tribes have a lot of positive impacts such as providing moral support, helping each other rise up, maintaining a symbiotic relationship and providing creative relief. Tribes may also have negative impacts and he stressed that we must pick and choose the right company as a tribe can 'make' or 'break' us. The most essential aspect of a tribe is to have similar ideologies, goals and values so we can fuel each other's dreams and aspirations.

A few workers from Michelin tyres often travelled to different destinations and enjoyed the food at different restaurants which lead to this tribe growing in popularity and eventually lead them to start grading and critiquing restaurants. The best among these were called "Michelin Star Restaurants. This was another anecdote to correlate the notion of tribes.

He also spoke about super fans and how one positive impact to a person (or patient) leads to brand building and promotion while citing a mattress company and a happy customer as an example.

This was followed by a remarkable Q and A session where he mentioned the dynamics of impostor syndrome and how to tackle it. This left the students to have a more positive outlook of events and had them inspired and motivated to be further ambitious in their future endeavours.

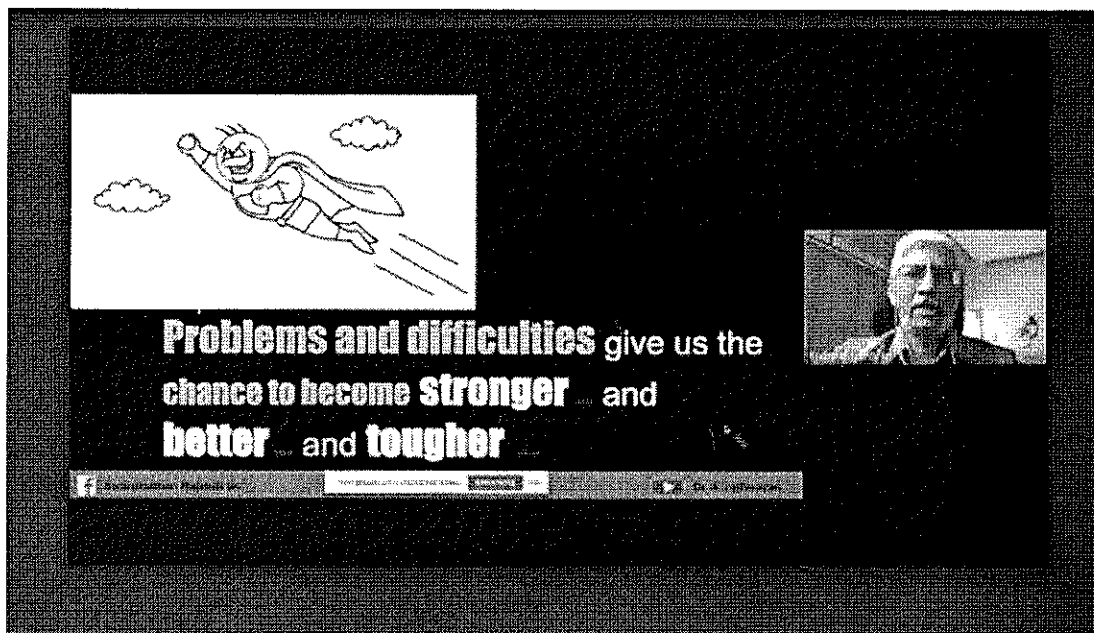
There were 154 Undergraduate Medical students who enthusiastically attended the talk. Rather than a didactic lecture, it was more interactive session. Lots of thoughts and queries of the students were addressed by the speaker. The effectiveness of the talk was shown in the feedback form submitted by the students, where 97% felt that the speaker communicated at a level conducive to the students' learning. About 90% of students felt motivated that they can be successful in their career and 88% felt the importance of planning their future. Though it was the first time for most of the students in hearing a motivational talk, 98% felt the talk was excellent and good in motivating their minds and plan their future

to the best. The Program was coordinated by the M. B. B. S student council members and Dr.R.Chandru, Assistant Dean (Students) SRIHER.

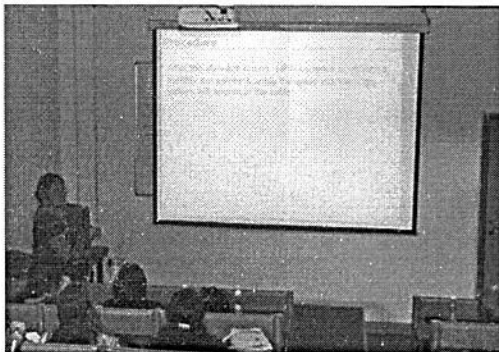
Description of Events:

Speaker: Dr.Priscilla Johnson, Professor of Physiology, SRMC & RI

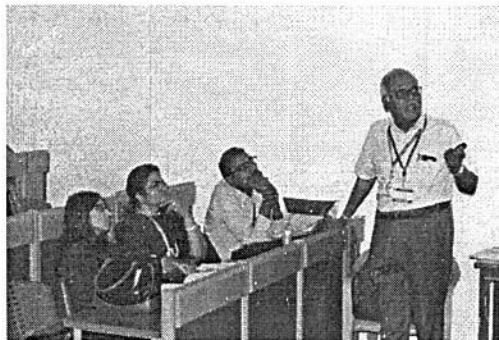

Speaker: Dr.V.Shankar, Professor & Head of Department of Neurology, SRMC & RI

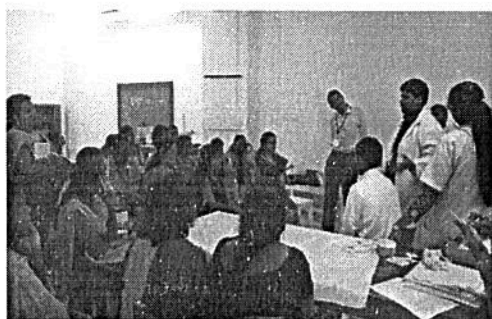
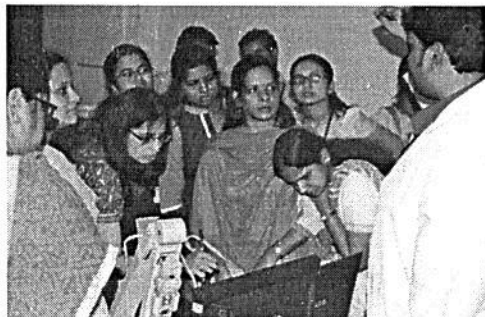

Speaker: Dr.K.N.Maruthy, Professor of Physiology, Narayana Medical College, Nellore.



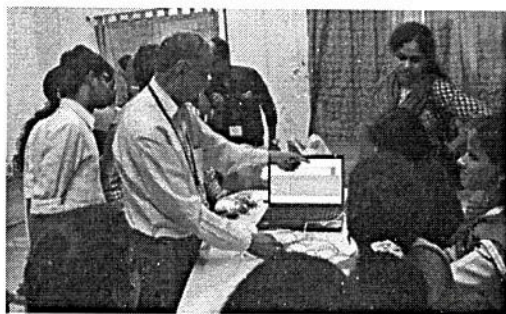

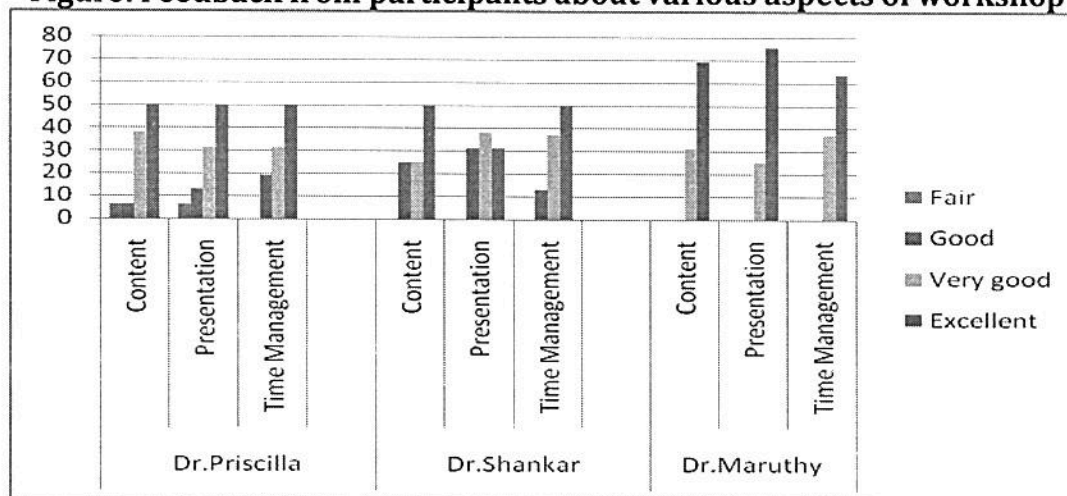


- The Dr.Teena Lal proposed the vote of thanks and the workshop came to an end.

Feedback from the delegates:

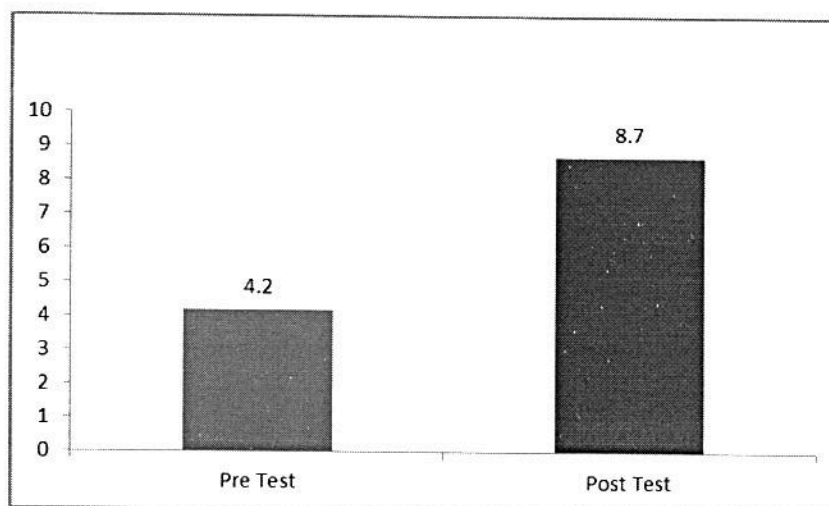

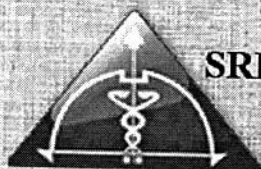

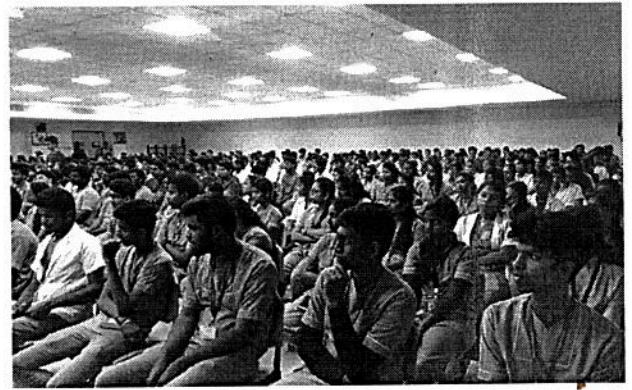
